## Classroom News:

<b>ELA</b>	<p>We are making our way through Mark Haddon's novel, <i>The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night Time</i>. As we examine characters, we are developing claims and evidence through the use of topic sentences and collecting details to enable us to organize our ideas through the use of quick and transitional outlines. These outlines will be the hallmark to the construction of a literary essay that scholars will embark on after the holiday recess.</p> <p><b>Office Hours:</b> Scholars should feel free to come the official ELA office hours on Mondays from 1:15 - 2:00 in room 415. <b>Math</b>	<p>Students in eighth-grade mathematics are mid-unit on linear functions. They are wrapping up a partner project involving rate of change, fixed costs, and how to compare two functions. Parents can give their students an example of a rate of change (taxi speed, pace of running) and ask their scholars how they would graph a line with that slope.</p> <p>Students in Regents Algebra I are beginning the topic of piecewise functions in class. Parents can ask their scholars about our snowstorm graph and ask them to explain why this was broken up into three "pieces." All students did a great job on their inequalities t-shirt projects.</p> <p><b>Reminder to both classes that students may log into TenMarks at any time and complete (non-evaluative) Jam Sessions! These are great opportunities to get instant feedback and practice math skills. <b>Science</b>	<p>We will be studying chemistry and the basic building blocks of life! We will be conducting many lab experiments that require your attendance in class, so please try to be at school every day!</p> <p><b>You can help your scholar by:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <b>Social Studies</b>	<p>We have begun our unit on the Progressive Era! We are focussing on how Americans used their First Amendment rights to make change to their society. Important figures of the time period include Upton Sinclair, Mother Jones, W.E.B DuBois, Ida B Wells, Alice Paul, and other inspirational change-makers. At home, you can talk with your scholar about present-day American activists (Black Lives Matter, the DAPL protesters, etc) are working to address problems they see around them. <b>Dance</b>	<p>This month we are exploring ballet technique and learning about significant figures in ballet history. So far, we have learned about Misty Copeland's rise to fame as the first black principal dancer at American Ballet Theater, the important, yet overlooked, role that men play in the ballet world, the seven movements of classical ballet technique, and the five positions of the feet.
