Dear 8th Grade Families,

Classroom News:

ELA	<p>Scholars in ELA are making their way from journalism and are moving into the world of literary fiction via Mark Haddon's novel, <i>The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night Time</i>. Themes will be developed, challenged, and documented through discussions, short paragraph writing (with an emphasis on coordinating conjunctions) - all culminating with a literary essay. To complement our class reading, scholars are encouraged to read an independent reading book so that they compare and contrast similar themes across stories.</p> <p>Office Hours: Scholars should feel free to come the official ELA office hours on Mondays from 1:15 - 2:00 in room 415. Math	<p>Scholars in eighth-grade mathematics have started their unit on functions, rate of change, and graphing lines. This is one of the major topics in our curriculum; the study of slope and rates of change is a fundamental step in the eventual road to calculus! At home, take notice of any applications of this: what speed are you traveling in your car? What was the pace of the winning marathoner? How many texts do scholars typically send per hour (when not in school, of course)?</p> <p>In Regents Algebra I, scholars are beginning their study of inequalities. After learning about compound inequalities, students are starting their inequalities business project. Ask your scholar about their group and what type of business they are creating in this project.</p> <p>Office Hours: Note that, as per an e-mail sent on Thursday, November 3, math extra-help is now being held during lunch on Wednesdays in room 409. Science	<p>This month in science class, scholars are continuing learning about ecology. Specific topics that we are investigating include: biodiversity and conservation where scholars discuss human population growth and its impact on biodiversity, carrying capacity, different biomes and how organisms adapt in each biome and the importance of ecological succession to restore an ecosystem.</p> <p>Upcoming Assessments: There is a unit test the last week of November that will cover ecology unit.</p> <p>You can support your scholars by reviewing their homework assignments on the Engrade Pro website. Social Studies	<p>Office Hours: Tuesday at lunch</p> <p>We have just launched our immigration narrative project! For this project, students will be writing “memoirs” in the voice of Jewish immigrants from Eastern Europe who immigrated to this country at the turn of the 20th century and settled on the Lower East Side. Ask your scholar about his/her “character” and what s/he will include in the narrative!</p> <p>Whatever your feelings about this Tuesday’s election results, I urge you to talk with your scholar about what they might expect in the coming months. Many scholars have expressed anxiety, confusion, and pessimism about the state of our nation. Others are calm and hopeful.
